

Dedicated Education Units - Europe Learning in Health Care 25th of May 2018



In a practice-based discipline, such as nursing or midwifery, it is required that students have enough practice experience in health care and social work organization. During the internship the student will experience the reality of the profession and the student acquires the knowledge, skills and attitudes related to the job. The authenticity of the practice environment and the active participation are the drivers in the learning process of students. The only effective solution to maximize students' learning outcomes during the internship is to create a powerful learning environment.

That is easy to say, but far more difficult to put into practice!

In 2015 five European organisations took the lead to break down the traditional clinical education model. They commenced from the Australian and American model "Dedicated Education Units" and applied this to the European context.

On May, 25 the project partners will share their experiences and results in collaboration with two prominent speakers, Ms Susan Randles Moscato and Mr Peter Rosseel.
